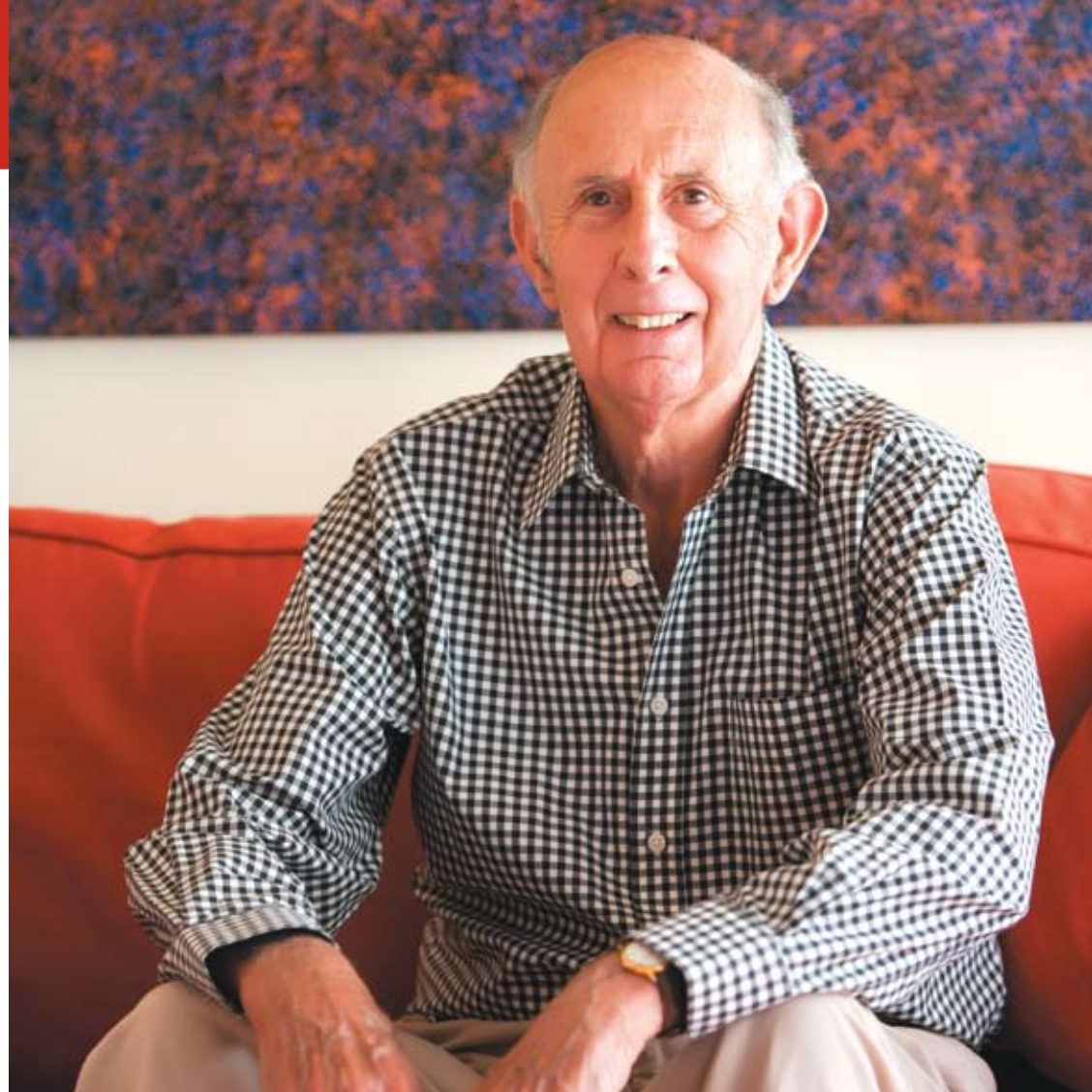
About the Heart Research Centre

The Heart Research Centre was established in 1989 by the Heart Foundation with three-year seed funding. The Centre became an independent organisation in 1993.

The Centre conducts research to help prevent heart disease and improve the quality of life of those who have heart disease. Research projects are carried out to investigate how to prevent heart disease by modifying people's lifestyles, improving their psychological health and increasing their social support.

Findings of the Centre's research are used to reduce the risk of heart disease in the community and improve the care of patients, particularly through developing best practice models of cardiac rehabilitation. Results are also passed on to doctors, nurses, physiotherapists and other practitioners who attend the Centre's world class training programs.

The Heart Research Centre is largely funded by donations and bequests.

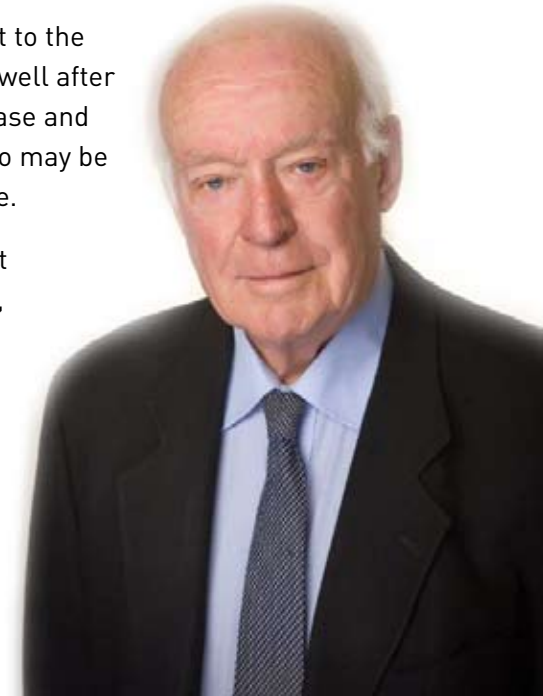
"I've been fortunate to be involved with the Heart Research Centre since its inception. I've seen first-hand how our research improves the health of Australians after heart attack or heart surgery.

How to leave a bequest to the Heart Research Centre

Tips

Make sure you include the full name of the Heart Research Centre in your Will or Codicil.

Please inform us you have left a bequest so we can plan our future life-saving research and also thank you for your gift!

Ensure you make a Will

Having an up to date Will is very important to ensure that your wishes are followed. A Will provides you with peace of mind. So don't delay.

Select which charities to include in your Will

You may wish to leave bequests to more than one charity.

Obtain advice from your solicitor

It is important that you obtain professional advice. Ask your solicitor about how to include a bequest to the Heart Research Centre. Different types of bequests are listed on the opposite page.

Made your Will already?... Consider simply adding a Codicil

If you have already made or recently updated your Will, you can ask your solicitor to draw up a Codicil stating your wish to include a gift to the Heart Research Centre. The Codicil can then be kept with your existing Will.

Deciding which kind of bequest to leave

The main types of bequests you can make after choosing your charity are as follows:

Residual legacy

A residual legacy is what is left of your Estate after all your other wishes have been carried out, including provisions made for your family. Leaving the residue of your Estate to a charity has the advantage that the legacy maintains its relative value over time.

Specific legacy

This is a gift of a stated amount of money, a specific item or group of items, such as stocks and shares, jewellery or property.

Percentage or fractional legacy

This is a bequest expressed as a percentage or fraction of your Estate.

Whole Estate

A bequest which comprises the entire Estate is often left by people who have no beneficiaries or those wanting to achieve something very significant

"A few years ago, I participated in a research project conducted by the Heart Research Centre. It was the first large Australian study about the long-term effects of a heart illness upon women. By leaving a bequest to the Centre in my Will, I hope to help the Centre continue its valuable research into the needs of women with heart disease and those at high risk. Since my own heart attack, I have found out that it's not just a disease which affects men. It's also a major cause of death among women."
