A city winner for a change!



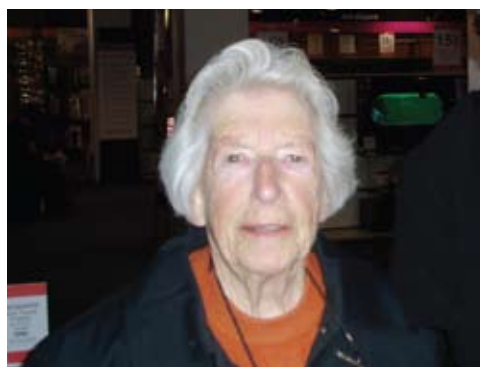
John and Rhonda Wright
